## Stay sober, false rape woman told

A drunk disabled woman who made false claims of rape has been ordered to stay sober for six months.

Carole Collin, 35, admitted calling 999 on four occasions and telling ambulance staff she had been raped.

Police traced the calls and she repeated her claim. But two days later Collin admitted she had made it up.

Collin, of Innerleithen, Peeblesshire, pleaded guilty to making the false claims on January 17.

Sheriff Derrick McIntyre ordered Collin to repay GBP567 that was wasted on a police investigation. He also deferred sentence for six months and placed her on bail, on condition she doesn't drink alcohol.
