

Felony charges against Nashua man dropped, including rape and impersonating police

NASHUA — A local man accused of impersonating a police officer last year has had all charges dismissed.

last week, according to court records.

were dropped

was arrested in September after a woman claimed she was sexually assaulted by him. She told police that when a male friend came to pick her up after the incident, pointed a gun at him, said he was a police officer and ordered him to leave, police said earlier.

was charged with false impersonation, criminal threatening and two counts of aggravated felonious sexual assault. He was later indicted on all of the same offenses in November.

Last week, however, all of the charges against were dismissed, according to a court clerk, who said the case is now closed.

Attorney Michael Davidow, a New Hampshire public defender, notified on June 12 that Hillsborough County Attorney's Office had dropped the charges.

"After reviewing the evidence for a final time and apparently speaking to both (alleged victims), Assistant County Attorney Lisa Drescher decided that she would no longer prosecute these charges," Davidow wrote in a letter to that was provided to the New Hampshire Union Leader.
