Detective cleared of rape and sex assault

A MARRIED detective constable accused of sexually assaulting a woman he had an affair with and raping her daughter has been acquitted.

Detective Constable Mark Glover, of South Wales Police, was today found not guilty of three counts of rape, two counts of assault by penetration, and two counts of sexual assault.

Mr Glover, 46, from Carys Close in Penarth, South Wales, who denied anything sexual ever happened between him and the daughter, said that he had sexual contact with the woman including intercourse but that it was always consensual, during his trial at Cardiff Crown Court.

The officer, who has been based at Barry and Bridgend police stations, told the jury he did not sexually assault either woman.

Mr Glover, who worked for Barclays Bank before joining the force in 1995, said he had an affair with the older woman some years ago which "fizzled out".

But he then had consensual sexual contact with her on two occasions more recently, one which would have been at around the time of the alleged offences, he said.

He served first as a response officer before joining the drugs team in CID and later being called to work in London following the bombings in 2005.
