

## Muscotah shooting set for plea

Instead of hearing evidence stacked against him involving an accidental shooting, a 19-year-old Muscotah man waived his right to a preliminary hearing Thursday in district court.

Isaac K. Bohnenkemper is tentatively scheduled to plead his innocence or guilt at 1 p.m. Monday, Aug. 25 on one count aggravated battery.

The charge against Bohnenkemper arose from a March 19 incident that left Nathaniel "Nathan" Julo seriously injured. Julo sustained a close range gunshot wound from a .45 caliber handgun Bohnenkemper had recently purchased. Bohnenkemper was showing Julo the gun when it unexpectedly discharged. The bullet struck Julo in his leg area.

After an investigation, authorities from Atchison County Sheriff's Office arrested Bohnenkemper on May 5. He was booked at Atchison County Jail then released on bond.

In other matters:

- Ashley Gray, 28, Atchison, on July 21 waived her right to a preliminary hearing and pleaded guilty to felony interference with law enforcement. Her sentencing is tentatively scheduled for 1 p.m. Monday, Aug. 18. The charge stemmed from a 2013 incident when Gray falsely reported she had been sexually assaulted by a co-defendant involved with her concerning unrelated criminal activity. After Gray entered her plea she was released from the county jail on her personal recognizance.
- Joseph Daniel Hall, 36, Atchison, was granted an 18-month probationary period with a condition to attend mandatory drug treatment under SB123 on a meth conviction. During his sentencing hearing July 21, Hall was initially sentenced to 30 months with Kansas Department of Corrections for possession of methamphetamine. The sentence was suspended to probation. Hall's conviction related to an offense committed on May 30.
- Also on July 21, Laporshia D. Seymore, 19, pleaded guilty to misdemeanor counts of criminal use of a financial card and attempted use of a financial card. Sentencing is tentatively set for the 1 p.m. Monday, Aug. 18 docket in district court. Seymore was arrested July 8 in Leavenworth after it was determined she used a financial card that belonged to a

female victim whose purse was stolen from Walmart in Atchison. After court action, Seymore was released from jail on her own recognizance.

- Jacob Pospisil, 26, was released from jail after he entered a plea July 18, and was convicted on misdemeanor counts that included theft, criminal trespass and conspiracy to commit theft. Pospisil is tentatively scheduled for sentencing 9 a.m. Friday, Aug. 22 in district court. The conviction arose from a shoplifting scheme June 19 at Walmart.
