

Kidnap and rape story turns out to be false

Edward Adamson, 20, a barber residing at Dolfield Ave., and Garrison Blvd., and his twin brother, Elliott Adamson, 3900 block W. Franklin St., a driver for a laundry, were given probation before verdict in a carnal knowledge case when they appeared before Judge Albert Sklar in Criminal Court this week.

Testimony before the court showed the 15-year old Calverton Heights Junior High School 9th grade girl who originally claimed the twins had abducted and raped her had told a falsehood.

Her mother, a resident of the 1400 block Poplar Grove St., had the twins arrested on her daughter's first story last summer.

and then went wherever he wanted to go.

THROUGH THEIR attorney, James McAllister, the twins admitted dating the girl. Not knowing her real age, they said they thought her much older.

The young girl first appeared in Juvenile Court where she was found to be a delinquent and was placed on probation pending investigation.

The young men signed a statement in agreement with the disposition of the case, one year's probation, payment of court costs and the understanding if they get into any kind of trouble they will be returned to court and sentenced.

ACCORDING TO Lt. Violet Hill Whyte, after she and six police officers investigated the abduction and seduction story, the teenager confessed she had not told the truth.

She later said she had frequent intimate relations with both the brothers after she had met them while dancing at a tavern.

She dated the men regularly from March through June, she stated. The school girl also said she went to the barber's home after school on one occasion and stayed until the next morning.

The teenager also said she went after school to the truck driver's job, waited for him
