

END OF FAMOUS MASSEY CASE.

REPORT DISCREDITED WOMAN'S STORY.

Honolulu, Tuesday.
Judge Davis granted a motion by Prosecutor Kelley quashing the rape indictments against the four Hawaiian youths who were charged in the Massey case.

THIS ends the famous case, and the quartet walked to freedom.

Mr. Kelley asked for a dismissal because the Pinkerton Detective Agency's report, covering 279 pages, discredited Thalia Massey's lurid story.

The Pinkerton report said that the medical investigation showed no sign of rape. The only garment torn was a stocking. There was evidence that Thalia sustained several bruises, but these might have been accounted for by a motor car collision earlier the same evening.

Alibi Confirmed.

"It seems entirely within reason," says the material submitted by the prosecutor to the Court, "that Mrs. Massey's knowledge of the identifying marks on the faces of the four accused were acquired several hours after the events complained of."

The report presents a detailed study of the time and element, showing that it would have been impossible for the accused to commit the crime, and confirming their alibi that they could not have been near the scene at all."
